### EXAMINATION SCHEME

#### 2.1. Mode of Examination:

CUET (UG) - 2024 will completely be conducted in Hybrid mode (Pen & Paper/ Computer Based Test (CBT) mode).

#### 2.2. Medium of Examination:

**Medium of the Question Papers: Drawing from the National Education Policy (NEP), the CUET (UG)- 2024 will be conducted in English, Hindi, Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Odia, Punjabi, Tamil, Telugu, and Urdu.**

### 2.3. Scheme of Examination

1.	Total subjects	61 (33 languages, 27 domain-specific, and 01 General Test)
2.	Choice of Test Paper	Maximum <b>06 Test papers</b> (04 or 05 domain subjects including General Test and 01 or 02 languages).  Candidates may choose a maximum 06 Subjects including languages (Indian and Foreign) and General Test <i>Note: It is advisable for candidates to select at least one language.</i>
3.	Medium of the Test	<b>13 languages</b> (Assamese, Bengali, English, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Punjabi, Odia, Tamil, Telugu, and Urdu)
4.	Mode of the Examination	<b>Hybrid mode (Pen &amp; Paper + CBT)</b>  <i>Note: It will depend on the candidate count after the registration is complete.</i>
5.	Total Questions	40 out of 50 questions for all test papers and 50 out of 60 for the General Test ( <i>choice of 10 questions</i> ). Duration for all test papers would be 45 minutes except for <b>Mathematics/Applied Mathematics, Accountancy, Physics, Chemistry, Economics, Computer Science/Informatics Practices, and General Tests which would be 60 minutes.</b>
6.	Shift and Duration	It is proposed that for Pen & paper mode, there may be three shifts in a day of about two hours duration.

Subject combinations for each paper, type of questions in each paper, and mode of examination are given in the table below:

<b>General Test:</b> For any such undergraduate programme/programmes being offered by Universities where a General Test is being used for admission.	<b>50 Questions to be attempted out of 60</b>

From the above subjects/languages, the candidate can choose a maximum of 06 (six) subjects from all three Sections.</li> <li>2. 40 out of 50 questions for all test papers and 50 out of 60 for the General Test (An overall choice of 10 questions will be provided for all 61 subjects).</li> <li>3. It is advisable for candidates to select at least one language and the General Test.</li> </ol>	

4. *Duration for all test papers would be 45 minutes except for **Mathematics/Applied Mathematics, Accountancy, Physics, Chemistry, Economics, Computer Science/Informatics Practices, and General Tests** which would be 60 minutes.*
5. *The examination will be conducted on multiple days in two or three shifts, depending on the number of Candidates and Subject choices.*

#### 2.5. Tests / Subject covered under CUET (UG) - 2024

There are two or three shifts in a day. A candidate can choose up to **6 Subjects** for taking the Exam.

The list of Languages, Domain Specific Subjects, and General Test covered in CUET (UG) – 2024 is given in **Appendix II**.

#### 2.6. Duration of Test:

*The examination will be conducted on multiple days in **two or three shifts per day**, depending on the number of candidates and their combinations.*

**Note: Compensatory time for PwBD Candidates of 20 minutes for each hour examination will be given.**

#### 2.7. Syllabus of Test:

<b>Syllabus</b>	<b>Language</b> - Language to be tested through Reading Comprehension (based on different types of passages–Factual, Literary and Narrative, and Literary Aptitude and Vocabulary).
	<b>Domain Subject</b> - As given on the NTA website <a href="https://exams.nta.ac.in/CUET-UG/">https://exams.nta.ac.in/CUET-UG/</a>
	<b>General Test</b> - General Knowledge, Current Affairs, General Mental Ability, Numerical Ability, Quantitative Reasoning (Simple application of basic mathematical concepts Arithmetic / Algebra / Geometry / Mensuration / Statistics), Logical and Analytical Reasoning.
